







# a primer *on primers interior*

Type of Primer	What it does
Stain blocking Primer 	Protects new coat of paint against “bleed through” of staining materials like grease, dirt, rust, smoke residue and water stains. May be water-based, oil-based, or alcohol-based.
Drywall Primer 	Seals new drywall and joint compound to give top coat of paint a uniform appearance. May also be suitable for new plaster.
Vapor Barrier Primer 	High adhesion interior primer useful in bathrooms, kitchens, laundries and other damp rooms. Minimizes passage of moisture through walls. Utilized to keep humidity up indoors in wintertime.
Enamel Undercoater 	Used under semigloss or gloss paint to ensure that top coat will develop maximum gloss and have uniform look. For best results, lightly sand and clean dried primer before topcoating.
Bonding Primer 	Specialty primer designed for slick or glossy surfaces such as glass, tile, Formica or vinyl coated paneling (but not countertops). Forms a secure surface for top coat to adhere to.
Concrete Primer/ Sealer 	Cuts down dust on interior concrete floors and provides less porous surface for painting.
